After the reading of the Sunshine notice, Ms. Yolette Ross, Vice Chair, led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. This was followed by roll call by the Board Secretary, Jean DuBois. ## Athlete Student Recognition - (con't)

Dr. Keating asked Ron Case, Athletic Director, and Brian Rowan, Assistant Athletic Director, Men's & Women's Tennis Coach to come up and review for the Board the highlights of the athletic program's magical year.

Coach Case and Rowan chatted stats and introduced some of team ambassadors & coaches who could attend the meeting: from Women's Tennis - team ambassadors Michelle Duerstock and Tori Yeich; from Women's Cross Country and Track & Field, Assistant Coach Angela Dunn and team ambassadors, Catherine Dougherty and Rachael Cowgill; from Baseball, Josh Schwartz, Assistant Baseball Coach, Pitching and team ambassador, Jeff Singer. It was noted here that Coach Schwartz would be moving on in his career to become part of the University of Pennsylvania's coaching staff and that Jeff Singer was named Division III Baseball Player of the Year by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Singer will go on to play in the NCAA Division I program at Monmouth University. All those present were given an opportunity to speak to the Board about their experiences first hand. In addition above recognition, the following was highlighted as well: Baseball Coach, Mike Dickson was named the National Coach of the Year; GCC alumna Kristina Morgan was named the NATYCAA 2013 Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year: Ron Case was named (for the fourth time) the Under Amour Athletic Director of the Year; the college was awarded the National Alliance of Two-Year College Athletic Administrators (NATYCAA) Cup for the top non-scholarship two-year college athletic program and GCC is also the recipient of the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup, an award given to the top two-year college athletic program in the country.

Mr. Case provided each of the Trustees with an Athletics Yearbook 2012-2013, which is a compilation of the year's awards and statistics providing a comprehensive view of the GCC Athletic Division's successful year.

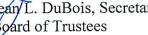

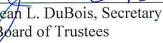
