  for proposals for a real estate development team to plan, finance, construct and
  operate a mixed use commercial and office space on College owned property in
  compliance with the New Jersey Economic Stimulus Act, Higher Education
  Public/Private partnership section that is befitting the mission of the College and its
  purpose as a public education institution.
- b. <u>Contract Award</u>: Renovation of College Center Mezzanine On the recommendation of the President, Trustee DuBois made a motion, seconded by Trustee Lavender and unanimously passed, to award a contract to Coastal Land Contractors for the renovation of the College Center mezzanine in the amount of \$36,647.00
- c. <u>Contract Award</u>: Classroom Technology Equipment On the recommendation of the President, Trustee DuBois made a motion, seconded by Trustee Love and unanimously passed, to award a contract to Total Video Products, Inc. for the purchase and installation of classroom technology equipment for the Adult Center for Transition and the Nursing and Allied Health Center in the amount of \$366,122.00.
