REGULAR SESSION MINUTES October 13, 2015

Chair Gene J. Concordia called the Regular Session of the Board of Trustees of Rowan College at Gloucester County to order at 6:30 p.m. in the annex of the main dining room.

Trustee Yolette Ross read the Open Public Meetings Act Statement: "In compliance with the 'Open Public Meetings Act' of the State of New Jersey, adequate notice of this meeting of the Rowan College at Gloucester County Board of Trustees was provided by the forwarding of a notice on November 18, 2014, to the *South Jersey Times*, the *Courier Post*, the Gloucester County Freeholder Director and Education Liaison, the Gloucester County Administrator, and the College Community." Trustee Ross then led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chair Concordia welcomed everyone and acknowledged Ms. Jessica Jolly, Faculty representative, and Mr. Kristian Reed, SGA President.

RECOGNITION

President Keating introduced Ron Case, Dean of Health, Physical Education and Recreation and Athletic Director. Mr. Case introduced Kelly Davis and announced that she and William Cheety were named the top student athletes of all two-year colleges in New Jersey by the

Collegiate Athletic Administrators of New Jersey. They then presented the CAANJ Cup to the Board. This is the 10th consecutive CAANJ Cup award earned by RCGC recognizing the Roadrunners as the top overall two-year college athletic program in New Jersey, and the 14th time the college has received this prestigious award.

President Keating introduced Judith Atkinson, Vice President of Student Services, who acknowledged Phi Theta Kappa honor society advisors John Ortiz and Michael Rossini. Phi Theta Kappa officers Victoria Sparks, Reilly Thompson and Emily Tiver were then introduced. The student leaders spoke about their experiences at RCGC, their future plans, the mission of Phi Theta Kappa and planned activities.

Ms. Marlene Loglisci, Executive Director, Human Resources, introduced new employees Mark Brucker, Eric Jenkins, Sarah Munson and Melissa Norbeck. She then introduced the Employee of the Month John Moore.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Keating mentioned that he met yesterday with college employees to discuss violence on college campuses and he will continue the conversation. He then introduced Joseph Getsinger, Executive Director of Safety and Security, who presented the annual Security Report.

Chair Concordia declared the September 8, 2015 Regular Session meeting minutes approved as presented.

REPORTS

1. Student Services

Ms. Judith Atkinson, Vice President of Student Services, spoke about the Open House they are gearing up for on October 15. She then introduced Kristian Reed, Student Government Association President, who gave an update on SGA goals and upcoming events and plans.

2. Finance

At the request of Trustee Doug Wills, Ms. Elizabeth Hall, Executive Director, Financial Services, gave an update on the College's finances.

- a. Statement: FY15 Informational: The FY15 Operating Report of revenues and expenditures as of September 21, 2015, was presented to the Board (attached).
- b. <u>Statement: Month Ending August 31, 2015</u>
 Informational: The Monthly Operating Report of revenues and expenditures was presented to the Board (attached).

3. Facilities/Property

At the request of Trustee Len Daws, Mr. Dominick Burzichelli, Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, gave an update on construction and revisions to capital projects. Trustee Daws then proceeded with the following Facilities/Property items:

- a. <u>Revisions:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Daws made a motion, seconded by Trustee Ross and unanimously passed to accept 2014 Capital Projects revisions.
- b. <u>Revisions:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Daws made a motion, seconded by Trustee Wills and unanimously passed to accept 2015 Capital Projects revisions.
- c. <u>Change Order:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Daws made a motion, seconded by Trustee Wills and unanimously passed to accept Change Order Number Two with Arthur J. Ogren, Inc. for the project known as Nursing and Allied Health Center in the amount of \$133,308.
- d. <u>Bid Award</u>: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Daws made a motion, seconded by Trustee Griffith and unanimously passed to approve a contract for the renovation and repurposing of the Health Science building into the Business and Corporate Center to Aliano Brothers in the amount of \$1,144,570.
- e. <u>Bid Award:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Daws made a motion, seconded by Trustee Ross and unanimously passed to approve the award of a fair and open contract to Advanced Audio Video for the purchase and delivery of classroom technology equipment in the amount of \$55,758.30.

Trustee Ross mentioned that she, along with Trustees Lavender and Griffith, toured the new Nursing Allied Health building earlier this evening and it was very impressive.

4. Academic & Student Services

At the request of Trustee Lavender, Dr. Linda Hurlburt, Vice President Academic Services, gave an update on happenings in the Academic division. Trustee Lavender then proceeded with the following items:

- a. Approval to Apply and Upon Award, Approval to Accept: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Love and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution granting permission to apply for and, upon award, approval to accept funding from the National Science Foundation for an Advanced Technology Education grant in the amount of \$200,000, for the period of January 1, 2016, to December 31, 2019 (Resolution attached).
- b. Approval to Apply and Upon Award, Approval to Accept: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Love and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution to apply for and, upon award, approval to accept funding from the Gloucester County United Way for the RSVP Senior Corps Corporation for National and Community Service Grant for the period April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2019 in the amount of \$60,673 per year (Resolution attached).
- c. Approval to Apply and Upon Award, Approval to Accept: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Ross and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution to apply for and, upon award, approval to accept and sign a Law Enforcement Officers Training and Equipment Fund (LEOTEF) grant from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Attorney General, Department of Law and Public Safety, for the period of July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, in the amount of \$10,832 (Resolution attached).
- d. <u>Approval to Apply and Upon Award, Approval to Accept</u>: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Love and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution to apply for and, upon award, accept

- and sign a Law Enforcement Officers Training and Equipment Fund (LEOTEF) grant from the State of New Jersey, Office of the Attorney General, Department of Law and Public Safety, for the period of July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015 in the amount of \$9,367 (Resolution attached).
- e. <u>Approval to Accept:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Griffith and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution to accept the second and third year funding from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts Local Arts Program for the period of January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017 in the amount of \$60,113 (Resolution attached).
- f. Approval to Accept: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Daws and unanimously passed, to approve a resolution to accept the final year of funding from the New Jersey Historical Commission's three-year General Operating Support grant for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 in the amount of \$7,330 (Resolution attached).
- g. <u>Approval of Program Options</u>: On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Wills and unanimously passed, to authorize Rowan College at Gloucester County to offer program options for the Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, and Associate in Applied Science degrees as listed on the attached resolution, effective November 1, 2015 (Resolution attached).
- h. <u>Approval of Change in Nomenclature:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Love and unanimously passed, to authorize Rowan College at Gloucester County to change the names of the programs and certificates listed on the attached resolution, effective November 1, 2015 (Resolution attached).
- i. <u>Approval of Program Terminations:</u> On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Lavender made a motion, seconded by Trustee Daws and unanimously passed, to authorize Rowan College at Gloucester County to terminate the programs and certificates listed on the attached resolution, effective November 1, 2015 (Resolution attached).

5. Personnel

On the recommendation of the President, Trustee Ross made a motion, seconded by Trustee Wills and unanimously passed, to approve the Education/General Fund Actions and College Winter Recess as listed on the attached (Personnel Actions attached).
