REGULAR SESSION MINUTES September 13, 2016

Chair Concordia welcomed everyone and acknowledged Ms. Jessica Jolly, Faculty representative, and Freeholder Lyman Barnes, Education Liaison. He introduced and welcomed Taheem Murray, Student Government Association representative, and thanked everyone for attending.

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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Keating discussed critical institutional issues and explained that the issues would be used as a scorecard for which he will give updates going forward. He highlighted and provided updates on enrollment, the Rowan University relationship, high school partnerships, and capital projects.

STUDENT SERVICES

At the request of Chair Concordia, Ms. Judith Atkinson, Vice President of Student Services, gave a report of happenings in the Student Services division. She shared comments from a student and also from a parent expressing their appreciation for their positive experiences with the previous week's student orientation day. She then introduced SGA presidential candidate Taheem Murray.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION

Mr. Taheem Murray spoke about his background, his experiences at RCGC and with the SGA, and his plans should he be elected Student Government Association president.

WHEREAS, Rowan College at Gloucester County has a need to acquire transportation and driver services; and

WHEREAS, the College has caused proposals to be solicited in accordance with a fair and open process pursuant to the provisions of New Jersey Public Contracts Law and New Jersey Public Contract Law for County Colleges; and

WHEREAS, Six (6) vendors received copies of the proposal requirements; and

WHEREAS, one (1) sealed proposal was received and publicly opened on August 18, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the term of the contract will be for one year commencing on July 1, 2016, and expiring on June 30, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Rowan College at Gloucester County will have the option to extend the contract for two additional one year terms; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has Certified the availability of funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Rowan College at Gloucester County on the 13th of September, 2016 shall enter into an agreement with McGough Bus Company, Inc. of Sewell, New Jersey to provide transportation and driver services per the attached contract.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF EMERGENCY POWER AND LIGHTING IN THE LAW AND JUSTICE CENTER

(Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 – Non-Fair and Open Process)

WHEREAS, Rowan College at Gloucester County is in need of emergency power and lighting in the Law and Justice Center; and

WHEREAS, County Contract Law (18A:64A-25.3) does not require public advertising if the purchases do not exceed \$34,100; and

WHEREAS, the College solicited three (3) quotes for the installation of emergency power and lighting in the Law and Justice Center; and

WHEREAS, the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer has determined that the total value of contract will exceed \$17,500; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Unit Pay to Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4, *et seq* provides that when the values of a contract with a vendor exceeds \$17,500, that vendor is subject to the Pay-to-Play law; and

WHEREAS, Ray Angelini Inc. has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that neither Ray Angeline Inc., nor anyone with an interest in it has, during the one year period preceding the award of the contract made a reportable campaign contribution (as defined by N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4, *et seq.*) to any County committee of a political party in the County of Gloucester if a member of that political party is serving in an elective public office of the County of Gloucester at the time that the contract is awarded, or to any candidate committee of any person serving in an elective public office of the County of Gloucester when the contract is awarded, and that the contract will prohibit from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer certifies the funds are available; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Rowan College at Gloucester County on the 13th day of September, 2016 that the President or his designee are authorized to enter into a contract with Ray Angelini Inc., of Sewell New Jersey for the Installation of Emergency Power and Lighting in the Law and Justice Center in the amount of \$19,950.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Rowan College at Gloucester County hereby authorizes and directs a contract with Ampro Sportswear of Primos, P.A., as the lowest responsible bidder for the purchase and delivery of Athletic Uniforms and Supplies in the amount of \$44,334.50.

RESOLUTION OF THE ROWAN COLLEGE AT GLOUCESTER COUNTY BOARD OF TRUSTES ACCEPTING CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 1 WITH RAY ANGELINI INC. FOR THE PROJECT KNOWN AS EMERGENCY PURCHASE OF A BACKUP GENERATOR

WHEREAS, on June 23rd, 2015 a major wind storm blew through the Rowan College at Gloucester County Campus downing trees and cutting off power; and

WHEREAS, Rowan College at Gloucester County experienced the loss of power for seven (7) days forcing Administration to cancel all classes and activities; and

WHERAS, the emergency generator that powers the main boilers and pumps for heat and emergency egress functions for the Physical Education Center and Scott Hall ceased to operate during the outage; and

WHEREAS, Rowan College at Gloucester County increased the scope of work in the replacement of the emergency generator providing shelter in place capabilities in the Physical Education Center; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with New Jersey's Public Biding and Contracting laws the project was awarded to Ray Angelini, Inc. in the amount of \$190,490; and

WHEREAS, the change of scope in the project increased the cost to Rowan College at Gloucester County was calculated at \$71,910.70 more than the contract award of \$190,490; and

WHEREAS, change order number one (1) issued by the College is to provide Emergency Electric, Heat, Air Conditioning and lighting of the Physical Education Center which will serve as a Shelter in Place for the College and the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees on the 13th day of September, 2016 that the College will accept, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:34-4 and in favor of Ray Angelini, Inc., Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$71,910.70 thereby increasing the amount of the awarded contract from \$190,490 to \$262,400.70.


