Attached for your information is the 2011 Institutional Profile Report. This annual report includes federal and state mandated data as well as other institutional information such as number of students served, continuing education enrollments, characteristics of students, student outcomes, faculty characteristics, and research and public service activities.

Key findings include:

- *Enrollment increased* 1.8% between Fall 2009 and Fall 2010. (Pages 2-3) Fall 2011 census enrollment was 6,829, an increase of 3.33% compared to last year with full-time enrollment of 3,995 (up 0.13%) and part-time of 2,834 (up 8.21%). (Census Day Enrollment Summary) (Attachment #1)
- Registrations in Non-credit Open Enrollment declined 5.4% and Customized Training declined 53.5% respectively between Fiscal Year 2009 and 2010. (Page 5)
- Remediation Levels of First-Time Full-Time Students increased from 60.0% in Fall 2009 to 63.3% in Fall 2010. Notably, remediation rates within Math Computation decreased from 34.4% to 27.6% indicating that the high school outreach efforts in Math are working. (Page 7)
- Federal Funded Financial Aid Pell Grants more than doubled between AY09 and AY10: The number of recipients increased by 65% from 1,362 in AY09 to 2247 in AY10 with total awards increased from \$3.5m to \$6.7m. (Page 10)
- *Institutional Funded Financial Aid decreased* by 23% between AY09 and AY10; \$105,000 to \$81,000 respectively. (Page 10)
- *Graduation Rates increased* 2 year graduation rates increased from 9.3% to 11.8%. 3 year graduation rates increased from 19.9% to 22.4%. (Page 12)

GCC is ranked 5th in the state with respect to graduation rates (See NJCC Peer Comparison Data, 3 Year Graduation Rates, 2007 Cohort). The national average is 22% (Source: NCES) (Attachment #2)

• *Transfer-Out Rates decreased* from 23.1% to 22.5%. This shift is likely reflective of the increased graduation rates. (Page 12)


GCC is ranked 7th in the state with respect to transfer-out rates. (See NJCC Peer Comparison Data, 3 Year Transfer Out Rates, 2007 Cohort) (Attachment #3)


- Combined 3-Year Graduation/Transfer Rates increased from 43.0% to 44.9%. There are notable differences by ethnicity Hispanic and Black students have a much lower graduation rate and the highest transfer-out rates compared to white students. (Page 13)
- Part-time retention rates increased from 40.2% in 2009 to 44.5% in 2010. Conversely, full-time retention rates declined from 63.7% to 62.6% during the same time period. As part-time enrollments have increased by 10% retention of part-time students will be a major driver in maintaining enrollment levels. (Page 14)



Revised Graph with 2011 Enrollment














NJCC Peer Comparison Data 2010 Fall-to-Fall Retention Rates Full-Time Students

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") has determined, consistent with the recommendation of its counsel, that it is in the best interests of the College to amicably resolve this matter;

WHEREAS, representatives of the College and Keith Davis, individually, and the Davis Group, Inc. have agreed to resolve their dispute for the total sum of \$4,500 in settlement of the Davis Group Litigation;

WHEREAS, representatives of the College and American Zurich Insurance Company and American Guarantee and Liability Insurance Company have agreed to resolve their dispute for the total sum of \$7,500 in settlement of the Insurance Litigation;

WHEREAS, the College's counsel in this matter, Archer & Greiner, P.C., has recommended to the College that it agree to settle the Davis Group Litigation and the Insurance Litigation as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") has determined, consistent with the recommendation of its counsel, that it is in the best interests of the College to amicably resolve these matters without the need for further litigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:
