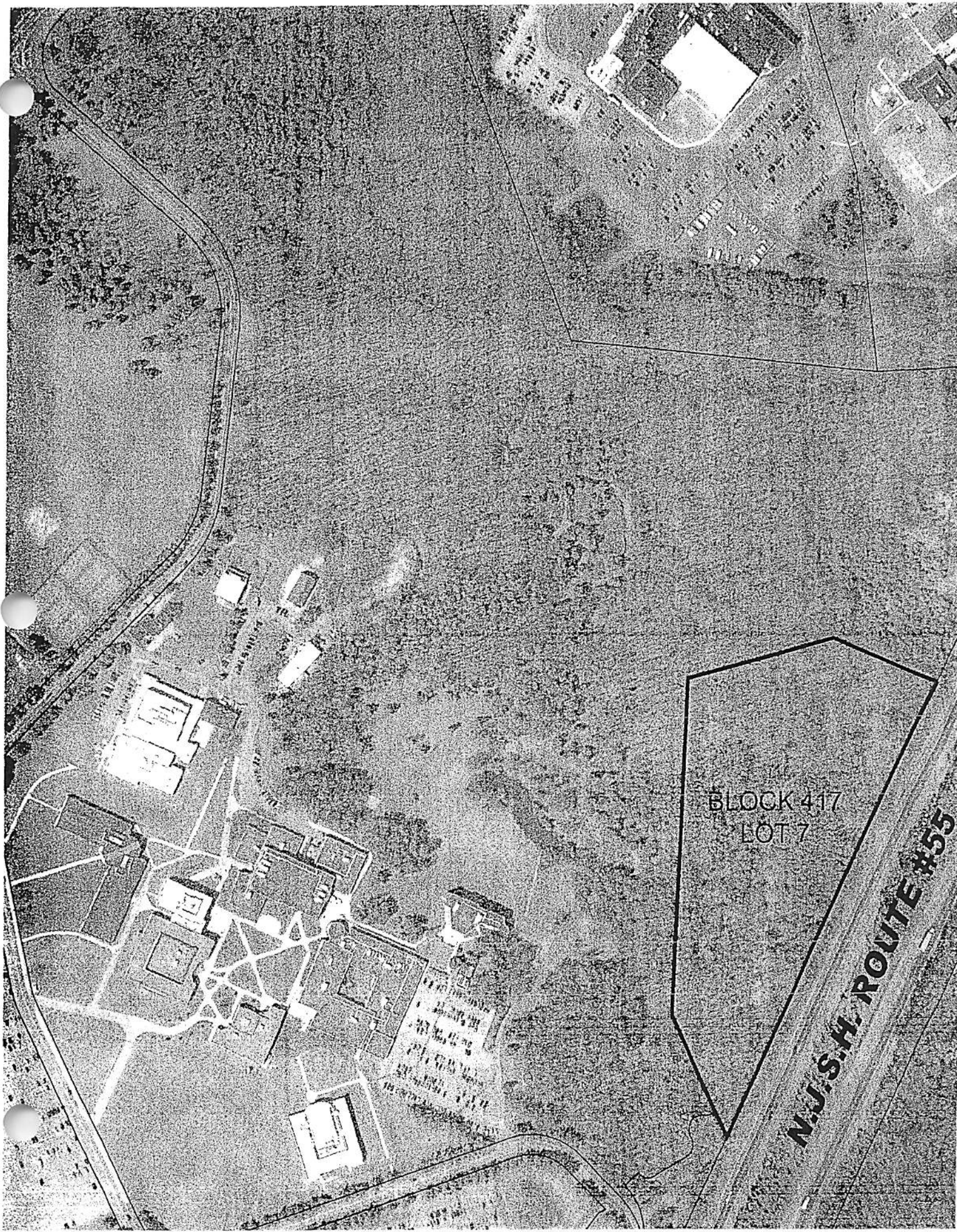
## Land Utilization Abstract

The Gloucester County College (GCC) campus is approximately 270 acres with twelve buildings. The grounds are part of the Gloucester County Educational Campus which also includes the Gloucester County Institute of Technology and Gloucester County Special Services School District. Currently GCC's campus includes a 2.4-mile (3.9 km) walking and jogging trail (available for use by guests/visitors as well as students, faculty, and staff) that goes through part of the forested area of the campus with 76 trail markers with GPS coordinates available. The grounds are also used for the Community Gardens project, which started in 1973. In this project, county residents can rent small plots of GCC land to use for raising vegetables, flowers, and other plants. Revenues from this project are donated to the GCC Foundation for student scholarships.

The acquisition of the 15+ acres of land would allow the college to expand the opportunities for outdoor studies and research. The Biology and Earth Science classes regularly utilize the bottomland forest area of the GCC campus as well as the open fields, lawns, trees, streams, ponds, and un-mowed areas. Studies include flora and faunal studies, weather, astronomy, air and water quality, soil, ecology, and collection of materials used in the classroom. Additional lab experiments can be incorporated into studies of at least 10 of our Biology and Physics courses.

Our Civil Engineering and Drafting programs will also utilize the proposed area. Surveying lab projects would incorporate topography analysis along with stream/pond usages as boundary lines. Site planning, structural design, construction, and environmental projects can also be implemented into the curriculum.

Longer term opportunities for land usage will also be investigated. Some suggested ideas include workshops on wetland delineation, surveying, and biodiversity assessment. Interpretive trail systems, outdoor classroom pavilion(s), and the development of environmentally sustainable structures would also be viable considerations.

# NATYCAA STANDINGS

## BUTLER AND OCEAN COUNTY LEAD FIRST NATYCAA STANDINGS OF 2011-12

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colorado


**B**utler Community College (Kan.) and Ocean County College (N.J.) lead the Fall 2011 NATYCAA (National Alliance of Two-Year College Athletic Administrators) Cup Standings, which were recently announced by NATYCAA President Gary Broadhurst (Athletic Director at Mohawk Valley CC, N.Y.).


Butler leads the scholarship division while Ocean County is atop the non-scholarship standings. Iowa Western Community College, Tyler Junior College (Texas), Darton College (Ga.) and Central Arizona College round out the top five of the scholarship division. In the non-scholarship division SUNY-Delhi (N.Y.) is 17 points off Ocean County, followed by Herkimer County Community College (N.Y.), Howard Community College (Md.) and Fashion Institute of Technology (N.Y.).

Rankings in the NATYCAA Cup are formulated by awarding institutions with points based on performance at NJCAA Championship events. A first place finish is worth 20 points; second place is worth 19 points; etc. Top 20 finishes in select NJCAA sponsored sports earn points in the NATYCAA Cup Standings.

Butler's fall season was highlighted by its football team finishing with an 11-1 overall record and No. 2 ranking in the final NJCAA Football Poll. The Grizzlies edged Trinity Valley Community College (Texas) 17-14 in the Citizens Bank Bowl and won the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference title for the eighth time in 10 years. The Butler women's soccer team captured fifth place at the Division I Women's Soccer Championship in addition to both cross country teams earning top 15 finishes at the DI Men's & Women's Cross Country Championships.

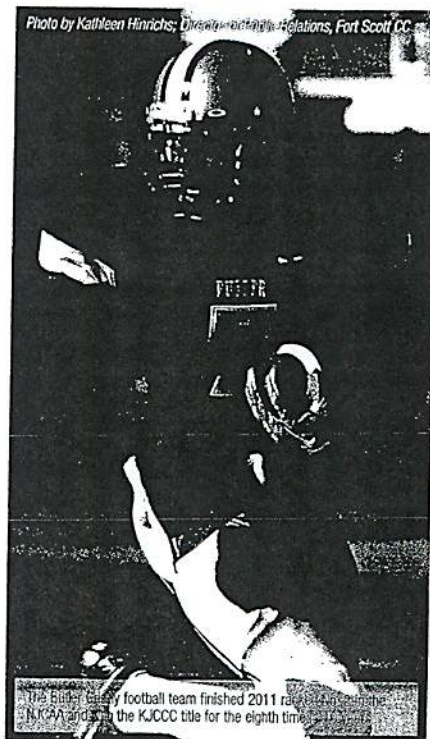

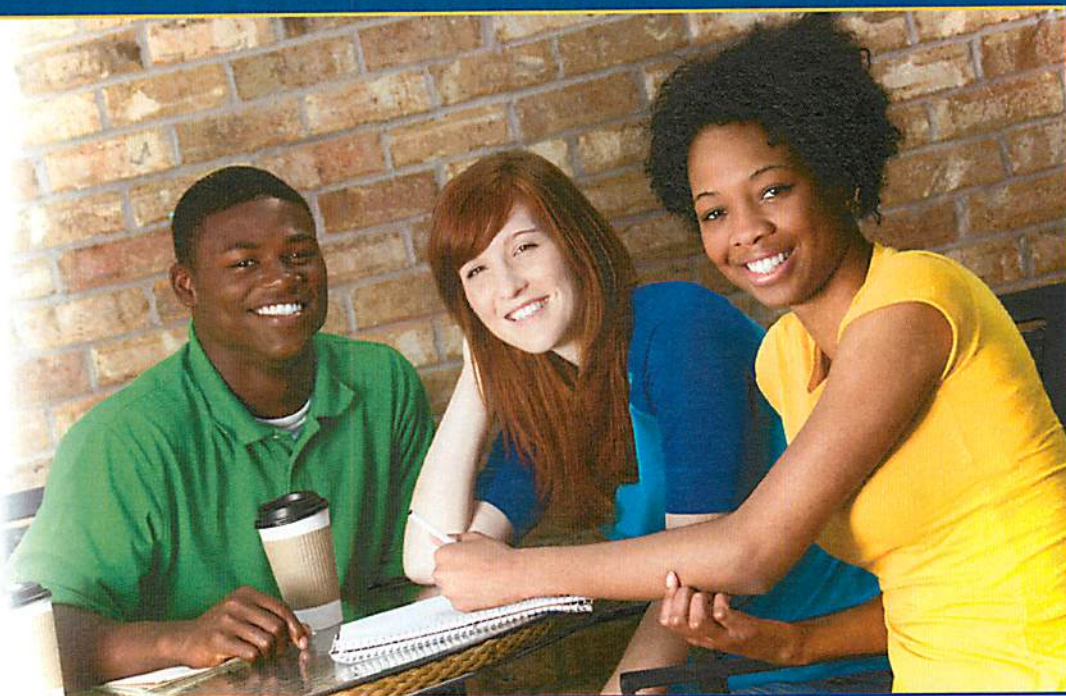

## GCC & KINGSWAY HIGH SCHOOL ESTABLISH STEM AGREEMENT

Deptford Twp – Officials from Gloucester County College and Kingsway Regional High School endorsed a partnership agreement on Wednesday, March 7, created to cultivate careers in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

Beginning in September, 25 academically-gifted students interested in pursuing careers in science, technology, engineering and math will be accepted into the Kingsway School District's new STEM Preparatory Academy. The program, which will be divided into two phases, includes two years of interdisciplinary education requirements and two years of advanced study aligned with GCC's STEM division. Under the agreement, GCC will award up to 16 credits through dual credit coursework. This is the first partnership between the school district and the college.

The GCC / Kingsway agreement was designed to better prepare students for in-demand careers in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math. Students interested in participating in the Kingsway STEM Preparatory Academy may apply for acceptance at the end of their eighth-grade year. Prior academic achievement, standardized testing data, and teacher recommendations will be significant components in the selection process. Entrance into the second phase during junior year will be based on student academic performance and submission of PSAT scores.

"Kingsway's new STEM Academy began as an idea generated through community discussion during our strategic planning process. As a result, we went right to work developing a program that would meet the needs of our students," said Kingsway Regional School District Superintendent Dr. James Lavender. "By forging a new partnership with Gloucester County College, we provide more learning opportunities for our students in the fields of biology and chemistry. Given the role biochemistry plays in

our future and emerging job sectors, this is a wonderful opportunity for our students and we are excited to have made it possible for them. Though biology and chemistry was our natural first-step, we are encouraged by other STEM initiatives we are currently working on that will benefit our students greatly.”

According to the United States Commerce’s Economics and Statistics Administration, “growth in STEM jobs has been three times greater than that of non-STEM jobs over the last 10 years. And throughout the next decade, STEM occupations are projected to grow by 17 percent, compared to 9.8-percent growth for other occupations.”

“It’s important that Gloucester County students are given the opportunity to specialize in advanced areas of study so that they possess the skills necessary to fill the jobs of the future,” said GCC President Frederick Keating. “Kingsway’s STEM Academy will introduce students to a variety of career possibilities. Gloucester County College will play an integral role in helping students get a head start in achieving those career goals. STEM education and jobs have been closely linked to global competition and are essential to our country’s future.”

GCC’s 250-acre campus is located on Tanyard Road in Deptford, just off Exit 56 of Route 55.
