Introduction

Your 2024–2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The RCSJ Office of Financial Aid is required by federal regulation (*34 CFR, 668.51-61*) to compare the information from your FAFSA to the information provided on this form and your tax documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information will be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the forms to the Office of Financial Aid. **Failure to do so may result in a delay in receiving your financial aid.** Eligibility cannot be calculated, and awards packaged until the verification process is complete.

Dependency Status
