T MAY SEEM LIKE AN OBVIOUS CONCEPT, BUT AT ROWAN COLLEGE OF SOUTH JERSEY, we always put students first in decisions that are made. By doing so, our students experience a culture of care and support that is unmatched in the classroom, on the field, with advisors, and when they secure employment with our industry partners. This holistic approach to education that incorporates the whole student as an individual is what propelled RCSJ to be named a Top 150 Community College in the nation by the Aspen Prize. *Our students succeed*.

We are proud to be a community college and RCSJ is redefining what it means to be one through our innovative partnerships. We have successfully built an "Eds, Meds, and Commerce" corridor along Route 55, which includes our Premier Partner, Inspira Health. Additionally, RCSJ is the only community college to have a medical school on its campus. Flagship Partner, Rowan University, expanded their School of Osteopathic Medicine to our Gloucester campus, and Rowan Medicine—in partnership with Cumberland County leadership and Virtua Health—opened its doors this spring to its first clinical facility on our Cumberland campus.

Both medicine and nursing are our pioneering pathway programs that clearly details what students need to do, and what will be accomplished each year of their education, including securing employment. Health and medicine are in-demand career paths in our region, so by providing clear pathways for our community, we can help ensure a sustainable career and support the needs of our local economy.

Lastly, we are proud of our DEI initiatives, providing our diverse student body with HBCU and HSI transfer partnership agreements with Lincoln University (Pennsylvania), Delaware State University, Rutgers-Newark, and St. Peter's University, respectively, to pursue their bachelor's degree.

At RCSJ, students receive academic pathways to achieve their educational goals and gain real-world preparation to transform knowledge into action and build lives meaningful to them.

In addition to above plans, RCSJ follows initiatives from The Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE) and Office of the Governor. Together, they issued A Student-Centered Vision for New Jersey Higher Education including a Student Bill of Rights with five points, which RCSJ meets.

Both the Strategic Plan and DEI Strategic Action Plan were written using an inclusive and collaborative approach with many internal and external stakeholders. The Board of Trustees have approved an extension of both through the 2025-2026 academic year. The College plans to use the results of the Middle States Commission on Higher Education selfstudy to inform a new, combined Strategic and DEI Action Plan. RCSJ's most important college-wide goals are:

A focus on the delivery of affordable, quality academic and career programs using methods convenient to the needs of both traditional and non-traditional students.

Partnerships with other strategic stakeholders will be built, enhanced, and expanded to assist students with affordable educational pathways and career opportunities as the community college continues to provide stability in the region.

To meet the increased emotional and psychological **needs** of contemporary college students, it is imperative to enhance and strengthen the College's support services network.

Create a more welcoming campus environment, which includes the elimination of barriers and the creation of engaging programs/activities for people of all backgrounds.





ROWAN UNIVERSITY, FLAGSHIP PARTNER

RCSJ's long-standing relationship with Flagship Partner, Rowan University, provides guaranteed acceptance to Rowan University for students who meet academic criteria, offers cost-saving opportunities like the 3+1 program, and opens the door to on-campus living for RCSJ students through Rowan Choice.

RCSJ offers eleven 3+1 programs with seamless transfer. Students complete three years of coursework at RCSJ and one year at Rowan University to earn a bachelor's degree in select majors for less than \$30,000.

ROWAN CHOICE

Live on Rowan University's campus and earn up to 60 RCSJ credits through the Rowan Choice program. All courses are taught by Rowan College of South Jersey professors at both RCSJ and Rowan University. 




Pathway Programs Have Added Value






