THR105: Fundamentals of Ballet

Lecture Hours/Studio/Credits: 2/2/3

Prerequisite: RDG099 or ENG 104

THR 105 introduces students to vocabulary and technique of ballet movements with emphasis on body alignment and effective methods for gaining strength and flexibility necessary for proper ballet deportment. The course includes barre, centre floor, and basic elements of classical ballet vocabulary.

- Ballet barre: concepts of rond de jambe par terre; passe par terre.

- Barre work.: battaments fondu. Preparation to tour pique en dedans.
- Barre work: battements frappes. Centre: pas balances. 1; 2; 3 arabesques.

- Barre: bat fondus and bat. Frappes combos for performance final. Dance variation.
- Barre: grand bat. Jetes combo for performance final. Centre work. Dance variation.
- Barre and centre practice for performance final. Dance variation.

Class Preparation and Participation Rubric
